

The Faculty of Social Work offers an undergraduate program, accredited by the Canadian Association of Schools of Social Work, leading to the BSW degree. In addition to the programs at the University of Calgary campus, there are also programs offered in Edmonton, Lethbridge and in several rural, remote and Aboriginal communities. Students can study for the degree on a fulltime or part-time basis. However, students in Calgary, Edmonton or Lethbridge must be registered full time when they enroll in the final field practicum, Social Work 408/409. There are five admission/program routes that are described in the section entitled "BSW

ffice Faculty of Social Work University of Calgary 2500 University Drive N.W. may be required to comply with any regulations that may have come into effect in regard to their program requirements. Students who choose to withdraw for a year will not be required to re-apply for admission. However, they must notify the Faculty of Social Work in writing by March 1 of their intention to return. Students who are required to withdraw for academic reasons will not normally be readmitted.

In order to take advantage of technically enhanced courses, video-conferencing and web-based tools, students must be familiar with navigating on the internet and have access to computer hardware and software. Some courses may be available only on-line or by video-conferencing. E-mail is routinely used to disseminate information to students. An e-mail address is required for full participation in Faculty life. Calgary, Edmonton and Lethbridge provide limited space in computer laboratories. Students should seek advice from the Student Services Office or the Manager of Information Technology (located in Calgary) if they encounter difficulties in meeting these expectations.

Students who have not met the University's Effective Writing requirement on admission must satisfy the requirement by the end of their first year in the Faculty of Social Work.

Arrangements can be made for the Effective Writing Qualification Test to be administered in Edmonton or Lethbridge.

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Field practicum courses provide an opportunity for the student to be directly involved in social work practice. Successful completion of these courses is a requirement for continuation in the program. The field practicum courses are Social Work 404 and 408/409. All continuing students planning to enroll in the field practicum courses must complete a "Field Request" form and register in the appropriate course(s). Students will be assigned placements in the field practicum based on availability, student interest and choices made by agencies. Information on field placement arrangements, including international placements, is available from the Director of Field Education.

Note: Students registered in the field practicum courses - Social Work 404 and 408/409 - are required to attend the practicum during Reading Days. Students should also note that Social Work practicum courses will normally run one week past the Note: Applicants wishing to take the complete BSW degree program at the University of Calgary may complete their ten specified half-course equivalents required for admission in a number of Faculties. Students who will have completed a Social Work Diploma at an Alberta Community College that has an admission agreement with the Faculty of Social Work may apply for admission to the 3rd year of the Calgary BSW Post-Diploma route. Such applicants

must also meet basic University admission requirements. Applicants not meeting University basic admission requirements cannot be admitted to the Faculty.

Applicants are evaluated on the following criteria:

- Grade Point Average on the final practice methods course and social policy course equivalencies taken within the Diploma and the grade point average on the last eight non-Social Work half courses (60%);
- 2. One letter of reference from the field instructor of record (5%);
- 3. Required essay (10%);
- A recommendation from the chair/ director of the social work program that the student attended (15%);
- 5. Relevant volunteer/work experience (10%).

Note: For those students who graduated with an Alberta Social Work Diploma more than five years prior to applying to the University of Calgary, three letters of reference are required in place of the recommendation from the chair/director of the social work program that the student attended.

In order to determine the most appropriate route, the Faculty will assess individually:

- Those students who graduated with an Alberta Social Work Diploma more than five years prior to applying to the University: or
- Those students who graduated with a Diploma from a college that does not have an agreement with the Faculty of Social Work.

Note: Refused applicants wishing to complete a BSW degree may consider entering the Calgary University Transfer Route. To do so, applicants would be required to present the same specified courses as regular University Transfer applicants and meet all other specified admission criteria. Non Social Work senior option
