The proportion of the proposal is the first of an unber of initiatives in the Eaulty of Science to dive solutions to current drallenges, and then provided an overview of the proposal to remme the Department of Geoscience, including the timeline, reasons for the drange, and consultation conducted. The proporties noted that dranging the name to the Department of Earth, Frency, and Frairconnect will allow the department to reliance its identity and growing programs, and better reflects its transisciplinarity.

Discussion included that transdisciplinarity across units is drallenging but there is excitement for future partnerships between the Faculty of Science and Faculty of Arts and great promise for positive workfor all faculty and students interested in Earth, Frency, and Fruironnent studies
